Trowbridge Sea Cadets – Trustee and Instructor Volunteer Recruitment

I'm writing on behalf of Trowbridge Sea Cadets, who are local to your organisation and would like your support.

They are a youth charity affiliated to the Sea Cadets UK, that provides a head start in life for young people through nautical adventure and fun. Our volunteers work, both directly with young people and behind the scenes, to help make a positive difference to young people who are often struggling in today's world and their communities.

Trowbridge Sea Cadet unit is currently looking for new volunteers to join as Instructors and Trustees to support the sustainability and longevity of the charity. What is involved as a Trustee?

The unit is managed and run by a few volunteers through their Unit Management Team (UMT). Together they are responsible for running the unit at a strategic and management level, ensuring the unit is safe, successful, and sustainable. The UMT meet approximately once every 6-8 weeks for two hours and attend an Annual General Meeting.

What is involved as an Instructor?

An Instructor within Sea Cadets is responsible for supporting the delivery of lessons and activities to help progress cadets through The Sea Cadet Experience. You do not need to have a background in the military or any formal teaching qualifications as full training will be given. All you need is a desire to help and support young people in gaining qualifications and confidence as they navigate their way to adulthood.
